

# **Needs of Urban Native Elders**

# Comparisons Across Urban, Tribal, and National Data

The Native Urban Elder Needs Assessment Survey (NUENAS 1.0) was developed in order to gain insight and awareness into the current health and social needs of urban Native Elders. The survey, which was administered from March 2021 through November 2022, includes data from 1,023 urban Native Elders ages 55 and older.

The current document provides several comparisons between NUENAS data (n = 1,023); Cycle 8 Needs Assessment data (n = 19,744), which refers to data collected through tribal communities that is used for Title VI nutrition and caregiving grants from the Administration on Community Living (ACL); as well as national data points (when available).

When compared with tribal and national data, the numbers for urban Native Elders indicate increased needs in several different areas. While such differences were not seen across all items measured, the values here showcase particular areas in which a larger discrepancy existed, and therefore may be indiciative of greater support needs.

## Disability

Urban Native Elders were generally less likely to say that they had excellent or very good health than Cycle 8 Elders and national data; they also generally had lower levels of screenings such as pap smears and PSA tests in the past year.

Compared to Cycle 8 Elders, urban Native Elders were more likely to report experiencing obstacles in receiving dental care, especially cost. They were also more likely to report being disabled, although there were no considerable differences in cause.

Urban Native Elders were less likely than Cycle 8 tribal Elders to regularly consume traditional foods, and generally reported greater levels of challenge with regard to nutritional items as well. Urban Native Elders were also more likely to be at a high nutritional risk.

When asked about services they were currently using, urban Native Elders were less likely to be utilizing home-delivered meals or senior center programs, but were more likely to report that they would use programs such as information and referral assistance, as well as home-delivered meals.

Compared to Cycle 8 Elders, urban Native Elders were less likely to report having enough money for food, and were more likely to report eating less due to lack of money as well.
